Children's Ministry is available at each of our Sunday services.

At 9 AM, Children age 3 - 3rd grade begin in the service and then are dismissed to our 2 classrooms: Preschool (age 3-5) and Godly Play (Kinder- 3rd grade) with prayer after the collect.

At 10:45 AM, Children age 3 - 6th grade head to their classes similarily, with the addition of our 2-3rd grade class upstairs and 4-6th grade class downstairs. PreK parents please come up to reconnect with your littles after the Peace, others will be dismissed from their classes to the sanctuary.

Nursery care is available at both services for children under 3. During the announcements, please pick up infants and toddlers from the nursery, and preschool children from their class. Older children will be brought to the Sanctuary at that time.

²⁰ If with Christ you died to the elemental spirits of the world, why, as if you were still alive in the world, do you submit to regulations—²¹ "Do not handle, Do not taste, Do not touch" ²² (referring to things that all perish as they are used)—according to human precepts and teachings? ²³ These have indeed an appearance of wisdom in promoting self-made religion and asceticism and severity to the body, but they are of no value in stopping the indulgence of the flesh.
